Viaduct Painting Project – Oct. 1

The aging, unsightly viaduct spanning I-70 from Colorado Boulevard to Brighton Boulevard will be coming down... but not quite yet. As part of the Central 70 Project, CDOT is proposing to demolish the viaduct and lower this portion of the interstate below ground. Until then, there is plenty of time to celebrate, mourn, discuss and activate this hidden Denver landmark.

A group of local urban artists will be painting murals under the viaduct between Brighton Boulevard and York Street from Sept. 27 through Oct. 1. On Saturday, Oct. 1, the community is invited to see the transformation and join in the fun! Artists will be on site as well as music, food trucks and info booths. Join us!

The Record of Decision (ROD) is the final approval document from the Federal Highway Administration and is expected later this year.
